## By-Laws

### of the BATS Sports Club

# Beep Cricket



These by-laws are to be read in conjunction with the International Rules of Beep Cricket.

### 1. Eligibility of players

- a. All players over the age of 13 and under the age of 70 who are a member of BATS Sports Club and registered to play in the BATS Inclusive Beep Cricket Competition are eligible to play.
- b. People outside the age group listed in Rule 1a may be granted permission to play by the Association Committee upon written request.
- c. Permission for people outside the age group detailed in Rule 1a of these By-Laws is at the sole discretion of the Association Committee.

### 2. Transfer of players

- a. Players may apply to be transferred between Teams participating in the BATS Inclusive Beep Cricket Competition. If approved, a charge for the change of uniform may apply.
- b. Approval for a player to transfer to another Team is at the sole discretion of the Committee.

### 3. Attire of players

- a. All participating players in any game organised by BATS Sports Club must be dressed in their authorised uniform, except in the case of new players who will be given two matches to comply.

### 4. Umpires' duties and conduct

- a. Umpires shall report in writing to a Committee Member of the BATS Sports Club of any case of misconduct as soon as possible and not more than seven days after the incident. .

- b. Umpires should ensure that fair safe and reasonable action of play shall be afforded to all players.
- c. Umpires are to ensure that players are properly and tidily dressed prior to the start of play and during play.

## 5. Protests

- a. If either Captain is dissatisfied with any occurrence during a match, they may protest to a member of the BATS Sports Club committee after the match. Captains are not to argue with the umpire during a match.
- b. The Captain shall initially notify their intention to do so by notating such an intention at the conclusion of the match and handing this note to a Team Official.
- c. All protests shall be presented to the BATS Sports Club Committee, in writing and as soon as possible after the game but no later than 7 days after the incident took place.
- d. The BATS Sports Club C Committee shall be the final arbiter on all protests lodged.

## 6. Role of the Competition Association – BATS Sports Club.

- a. The role of the Association is to:
  - 1. Produce and manage the Competition Draw.
  - 2. Assist with the recruitment of players and officials.
  - 3. Train and form teams for inclusion in the Competition.
  - 4. Provide participants with the necessary playing equipment.
  - 5. Provide access to the Competition Rules and By-laws.



6. Provide the Beeping Cricket Ball or an audible ball if a Beeping Cricket Ball is not available.
7. Provide a first-aid officer for each game.
8. Provide transport for participants as required.
9. Provide the Boundary Rope if required.
10. Provide match Umpires and Scorers.
11. Register the Association with My Cricket.
12. Register participants with My Cricket.

## **7. Role and responsibilities of the Participants**

### a. Participants are to:

1. Register as a member of BATS Sports Club.
2. Attend training sessions.
3. Abide by the Rules and By-Laws of Beep Cricket.
4. Treat all Officials and Players with respect.
